# Free Lunch for First Responders

Did you know that our Lions District 35 I has a disaster trailer ready to move when hurricanes damage our communities? After Hurricane Milton, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor and her team took the trailer, which is equipped like a food truck, to distribute hot meals to people whose communities had been devastated by the storm. When the worst of the emergency was over, and the district still had food in the freezer, Lion Linda offered the trailer to clubs with a good idea for service. That was easy! Venice Lions asked for the trailer to provide free hamburgers, hotdogs and Italian sausages to Venice's first responders to thank them for their service during the two hurricanes. On December 5, the food trailer was hauled into the Venice Police Department parking lot and the team started cooking. Over 100 meals were served to police officers, firefighters, sheriffs, and support staff. Lion Tim Werla demonstrated his cooking skills and a team of Lions served the guests. Thanks to the leadership of District 35I, we offered a great service project that day.



### **Wreaths Across America**

We appreciate First Vice President Tim Werla keeping service to veterans in front of us. In November Lions attended the return of the Veterans Honor flight, where our own Alf Kirkeeng was honored. In December Lions attended Wreaths Across America in Englewood. US flags were everywhere, and wreaths were stacked, ready to place on the final resting place of veterans from all branches of service. Long lines of grieving families read the names of veterans they had lost and rang a bell to honor them. There were no dry eyes that day. We live on in the memories of those who loved us.

Ann and Ray Favreau have been married for 66 years. They have 4 children, 4 grandchildren, and 3 great-grandchildren. Ray was an electrical engineer, Ann, a teacher. Lions has been an important part of their lives. Ray has been a Lion for 53 years, Ann, 45. In Agawam, MA Ann was president of the Lioness Club and Ray the Lions Club. They are both Melvin Jones Fellows, Ray from Agawam and Venice.

When they joined the Venice club, the Vision Clinic was their primary focus. Ray served on the Keerl Committee since its inception, chairing it many times. He greeted clients at the monthly clinics, registered them, and later did the related computer work. Ann became the clinic coordinator, training volunteers and managing the monthly clinics. She started the Eyeglasses for the Needy and Homeless Program at Trinity Presbyterian Church Community Outreach. She led the collection of toiletries for the needy and she and Ray always attended the Christmas Party for Venice families to bring them a bit of joy and gifts for the parents and children. Ray was one of the first trained on the machine to do children's vision screening which he loved doing. He led the Venetian Waterway Park Cleanup for many years and received the Beautification Award from them in 2008.

Over the years they have sponsored several Lion members. They have been involved with food prep for the Holiday Parade, led children in the Halloween Parade, joined in the White Cane Walk and Luncheon, worked at the Shark Tooth Festival, Gear Up Florida, and were global ambassadors for Lions distributing banners to Lions they met on their travels.

Ann has written articles for the Newsletter since 2005, had stories published in the Lion Magazine and the Florida Lions Magazine. She was a member of the Community Health Action Team, led strategic planning for the club, coordinated the models for the Mane Event Fashion Show, and wrote poems for the Sunshine Card Project. She has presented programs for the meetings.

# Reading Action Program, Year Two

Lion Jeff Myles started the Reading Action Program last year as his President's Project. His intention was to give books to children in families where there are limited resources to buy them. Lions International had promoted the Reading Action Program stating "a book is a dream that you hold in your hand". This year, Lion Bonnee Hagen led the project and she found a new group of children who would benefit from receiving a free book. She delivered 470 books to the Salvation Army Christmas Tree Program for children age 0-12. The Salvation Army had screened children for eligibility based on poverty guidelines. #### **New Caterer**

Thanks to all who responded to the meals survey. No one suggested we increase the cost of our dinners! We have found a new caterer who will be providing our meals for the same cost. Hotel Venezia, in Venice, is accustomed to delivering dinners to various non-profit organizations. Because the hotel has a strong catering business, it is able to provide the same meal they are catering to others to us. We will be following the same dinner protocol as always: members will be asked several days ahead of the meeting if they will be having dinner so that we can provide the final number to the caterer. We will experiment with meals from Hotel Venezia for a few months and ask members for their opinions about March.



## **Lions Geography**

Lions geography can seem complicated! Our organization spans the globe from the club level to clubs in over 200 countries worldwide. Add administrative structures and throw a few foundations into the mix and our heads spin.

Let's get the Lions geography in Florida straight first.

The state of Florida has been assigned a number: **District 35.** For administrative purposes, all the Lions Clubs in Florida are divided into four smaller districts with letters assigned to distinguish them: 35-**L**,35-**I** (our district), 35-**O**, and 35-**N**. Did you notice that together the four Florida districts spell "LION"? When we hear the term Multi-District, it is referring to the four districts in the state of Florida.

Each district has its own administrative team: a Governor with Vice Governors and a cabinet that advises and supports the clubs in its district. In 35 I, our Governor is Lion Patti Jean Strong. Lion Linda Gregory is 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor and Venice Lion Beverly Flynn serves as 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice District Governor. Lion Beverly will rise to 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor next year, and the following year she will be Governor of District 35-I. This structure is repeated in each of the four districts in Florida.

Next month we will divide our District into Zones to understand the local structure that builds bridges between clubs for sharing information and service projects.
